

## Using an Insulin Syringe: Easy as 1-2-3



- Gather your supplies.
- Determine your dose.
- Draw it up.




Make sure it is clean.



- Hold syringe like a pencil.
  Pinch up. Push straight into skin.
- Push plunger in.
- Let go of pinch and remove needle.

## Drawing Up Insulin – Single Dose



1. Roll the bottle, if using cloudy insulin, until insulin is mixed.




2. Wipe top of bottle with alcohol swab.




3. Take caps off of needle and plunger. Pull plunger down to




4. With bottle on table, put needle into bottle. Push plunger down to push air into bottle.



5. Turn bottle upside down.



6. Pull plunger half-way down to draw insulin into the syringe.




7. Push insulin back into bottle.




8. Pull plunger to \_\_\_\_\_ units. Check for air bubbles. If air bubbles are present, push insulin back into bottle and repeat steps 7 & 8.


## Step-by-Step: Injecting Insulin with a Syringe



Hold syringe like a pencil.



Pinch up skin and inject.



Let go of pinch and remove needle.
